



## High School: Scholarship Information for Academic Year 2025-2026 Students currently in Grade 8 - 11

The deadline for scholarship applications is **February 21, 2025**. Documents submitted with this Application Form must be in English. If any document is in a language other than English, a translation must be attached to the application. Grade 8 - 11 students must complete and submit the application themselves. Please note, parents must not complete the form on the child's behalf.

The awarding of scholarships will be decided by a Scholarship Committee which is appointed by the school. Scholarships will be given based on the applicant's academic excellence, as well as their contributions to the school and global community. The committee will evaluate the quantitative and qualitative data received from each applicant to decide, so it is important for students to put equal effort into each part of the application process. The committee will use all information provided in order to decide which applicant best fits the scholarship criteria. Student interviews may be requested as part of the selection process for finalist candidates.

All decisions regarding scholarships are final. No appeals or requests for justification will be accepted.

The Admissions Office will communicate the results of the application process directly with the parents of the applicants.

## 1. High School Global Citizenship Scholarship

### 1.1 Criteria

**HS Global Citizenship (15,000 RMB):** Four scholarships will be awarded to students from Grades 8 – 11. Please note that this might not mean one scholarship per grade level is awarded. Awardees are students who:

- demonstrate strong collaborative and problem-solving skills
- strive to be well informed on global issues
- consistently demonstrates compassion
- exhibit leadership skills
- are committed to being an active participant in the school community
- are in 'good academic standing'

Candidates will be evaluated by the Scholarship Committee based on the strength of student's personal statement as well as supporting information.

**All applicants must provide the following documents:**

- Online Application Form completed which will require supporting information about achievements, awards, extra-curricular activities, and community service in the past year. You are strongly encouraged to use the template provided for this

- Global Citizenship Personal statement: How does your education prepare you to think critically about global challenges? Discuss any specific classes, projects, or experiences that have shaped your worldview regarding global citizenship.

## 2. High School Learner Profile, Service, and Community Leadership

### 2.1 Criteria

**HS Learner Profile, Service, and Community Leadership (20,000 RMB):** Four scholarships will be awarded to students from Grades 8 to 11 who have best demonstrated the attributes of the IB Learner Profile and who are highly involved in the school community by providing service or as leaders.

Candidates will be evaluated by the Scholarship Committee based on the strength of student's personal statement as well as their involvement in the school community as leaders or volunteers.

**All applicants must provide the following documents:**

- Online Application Form completed which will require supporting information about achievements, awards, extra-curricular activities, and community service in the past year. You are strongly encouraged to use the template provided for this.

- HS Learner Profile, Service, and Community Leadership Personal Statement: Reflect on a time when you faced an ethical dilemma. What principles guided your decision-making, and how did you navigate the situation while staying true to your values?
